CHAPTER REPORT

Alpha-Delta Recognized for Academic Excellence

Chapter Achieves One of Highest GPAs in Fraternity, Continues to Increase Campus Presence through Focus on Recruitment and Philanthropy

Several undergraduate brothers attended the Kappa Sigma Leadership Conference in New Orleans this summer. While at the conference, the Alpha Delta's were awarded with one of the Academic Excellence Cups for having one of the highest GPAs of all Kappa Sigma chapters for the past school year. The undergrads finished the 2011-12 school year with a 3.30 GPA in the spring semester. These marks tied us with Beta Sigma Beta for the fourth best GPA in the IFC, far above the IFC average of 3.14.

In recruitment, the brothers of Alpha Delta put a full effort into a pivotal rush period this fall. Brother **Steven Koniuk** was elected as the rush chairman and did a great job coordinating the chapter's rush efforts. Over 1,200 students went through the recruitment process this fall and we made contact with close to 200 of them. Through events such as a BBQ, poker night, a football game, and other events, we got to know many of the great young men on campus. We gave out a total of 25 bids and secured 12 new pledges. Eleven of the pledges are freshmen and one is a sophomore, with majors ranging from engineering to accounting to economics. The brothers are excited about the new pledge class and the enthusiasm for the chapter they have shown so early in the pledge process. Two of the pledges are legacies of the chapter, **Nick Vough**, whose brother Mike graduated last spring and was a former Grand Master for the chapter; and **Declan Wilson**, whose father Matthew graduated from Penn State in 1982. Declan's grandfather was also a Kappa Sigma at William

and Mary.

For the first time since regaining our charter, the chapter participated in the Homecoming festivities. We paired up with

On the first canning weekend our pair raised \$6,100.30, so we are off to a great start! 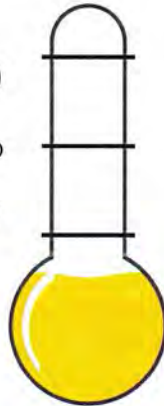

Brother Lands His First Job, Thanks to Kappa Sig

Rodd McDanel '77 Shares the Story of How He's Encountered Many Brothers Throughout His Career

Rodd McDanel '77 was always busy during his time as an undergraduate, taking part in fraternity activities like spring luaus and canoes race. So it should come as no surprise to find that he is even busier now. A permanent resident of the United Kingdom, Rodd is vice president of finance for the European division of Cookson Performance Materials, an electronics firm in England. Rodd spends much of his time traveling for work throughout Europe, so it only makes sense that he's also learning both the Italian and Dutch languages. When he's not jet-setting across the globe, he can be found riding through England's countryside on his new Harley Davidson Fat Boy.

Rodd is quick to attribute much of his success to the connections he made early on in his career to the Kappa Sigma brotherhood. After graduating from Penn State, he applied

for a cost accounting position with Alcan Cable (now Rio Tinto) in Williamsport, Pa. As luck would have it, his resume found its way to fellow Kappa Sigma brothers Paul Rill from Dartmouth University and Robert Mitchell from Washinton & Jefferson. Even though the brothers at Alcan Cable weren't from Penn State, Rodd's fraternity affiliation helped him get an interview, which led to his first corporate position.

"Kappa Sig was directly responsible for me obtaining my first job after graduation," Rodd says. "I have run into numerous brothers throughout my career around the world and we all shared the bond. This story may have occurred a long time ago, but it still holds true today for those in the Kappa Sigma brotherhood."

Although being across the pond has put a damper on Kappa Sig reunions and

gatherings for Rodd, he still maintains strong ties with his brothers from Penn State. He fondly recalls celebrating last Thanksgiving in Arizona with **Carl Bartuch '75** and his family. He also made it back stateside for the Penn State-Ohio State football game in 2010.

One thing that the distance can't interfere with is his Kappa Sigma memories. Like most of his Penn State brothers, Rodd shared many good times in Happy Valley, though he says receiving his bid to pledge, Tex the cook and snow football in the front yard are at the top of his list.

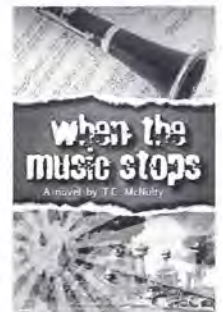

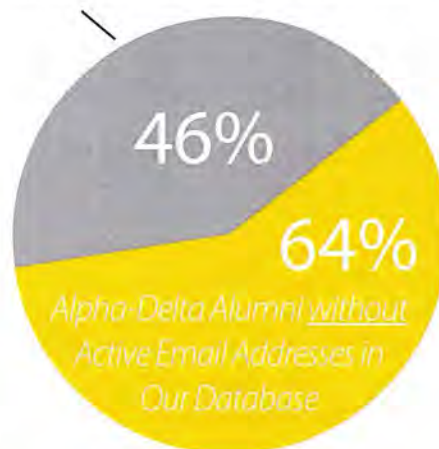
